This proposal will positively impact every student in our district!


Shall the Board of Education for the Cole County R-1 School District, without an estimated increase in the current debt service property tax levy, borrow \$5 million for the purpose of providing funds to address the following updates within the school district.

Junior High/High School Building:

- · Construct eight additional classrooms on the west side of the building
- Add and upgrade security cameras
- · Complete masonry repairs along the gymnasium wall to prevent further leaks
- · Purchase technology, furnishings, fixtures, and equipment for the new classrooms

Elementary Building:

- · Regrade existing playground
- · Purchase new playground equipment
- · Install a new HVAC system
- · Purchase a new speaker system for the gymnasium

How Much More Will It Cost Me?

The referendum for the November 8th Proposition K.I.D.S. ballot states the bond will be without an estimated increase in the current debt service property tax levy. The school board is not proposing to raise the current property tax levy. If the voters approve this bond issue, the school district will sell bonds to a purchaser who offers the lowest interest rate. The district will use those funds to complete the capital improvements and the debt is paid back over time.






Vote Tuesday, November 8, 2022

Proposition K.I.D.S. will be included on the Nov. 8 ballot. Voters located within the Cole County R-1 School District may vote at their designated polling locations within Cole and Moniteau counties. What Happens If The Bond Is Not Approved?

If the referendum is not passed and enrollment trends continue with anticipated residential properties being built, the district will look to add trailers to the high school campus to address student needs. A four-sevenths (57.14%) majority is required for general-obligation bond issues submitted at regular elections in April, in August primaries (in even numbered years) and in November.
